### **Advanced Nurse Practitioner (ANP) Appointments**

#### Face to face appointments

- Can only be booked if a patient has no covid symptoms and has not been advised to self isolate
- Patients must wear a face covering and attend their appointment alone if possible
- If a patient has covid symptoms they **must not** be booked a face to face appointment unless they have a recent negative PCR test. A **negative lateral flow test is not sufficient**
- Please adhere to appointment guide below which will be updated as covid level changes
- Strictly **one** problem per 15 minute consultation
- If patients are **unable** to provide a photo for the symptoms in the purple list they can be booked in on a face to face appointment **except sore throat as at present it remains clinically unsafe to examine nose and throats**
- If unsure which type of appointment to book please do not hesitate to ask an ANP

### **FACE TO FACE**

Abdominal pain Breast pain / lumps

Deep Vein Thrombosis (DVT)

- throbbing or cramping pain in 1 leg (rarely both legs), usually in the calf or thigh
- swelling in 1 leg (rarely both legs)
- warm skin around the painful area
- red or darkened skin around the painful area
- swollen veins that are hard or sore when you touch them

# **EXCLUSION**

Chest pain – Advise patient to call **999** if they have sudden chest pain that:

- spreads to their arms, back, neck or jaw
- makes their chest feel tight or heavy
- started with shortness of breath, sweating and feeling or being sick
- lasts more than 15 minutes
- or already have a heart condition

They could be having a heart attack and may need immediate treatment in hospital
